- Child support offices, whether they're local county offices or part of the Oregon Department of Justice
- Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT)
- City or county court
- Public school

- City mayor’s office
- City tax assessor
- Community college or public university
- City Human Rights Commission
- City police commissioners
- Probation departments
- Oregon Department of Corrections staff
- County jail staff
- Parks and recreation offices
- Elected officials including state legislators
